Wear a Fez...Who Sez?

Have you ever wondered how the Fez originated....Where the Fez originated....or aren't sure of the Proper way to Respect your Fez?

The below article appeared in the April 1976 edition of the Tangier Hot Sands. It answers these questions, and a few others, as well as serving as a reminder of proper Fez Etiquette. The article is unedited and printed as it appeared.

Nobles of the Mystic Shrine have come to believe that the fez is our own "particular badge." Some of us resent its use by other organizations. The fez was first adopted by the Fraternal organization as a headdress by the Shrine, but it was old as a headdress long before.

The fez is so named from the headdress characteristics of the inhabitants of the city of Fez, Morocco. Its use as a part of the uniform for organizations other than those of the Mohammedan faith began when the French organized a regiment of Zouaves in Algeria in 1831.

Since that time, many military organizations of a more or less showy character adopted the Zouave dress and the Fez. In the Civil War in the United States there were several such units, but the gaudy colors made too good a target for the modern high-powered rifle, so the dress has been abandoned in military circles.

The interest in military affairs due to the Civil War caused many independent military companies in the late sixties and early seventies to adopt the Zouave dress and its distinctive Fez. This doubtless influenced the first Shriners in their decision to adopt the Fez as a headdress, particularly for an organization that had an Arabic background for its ritualistic work.

Originally, the fez of a Shriner was a simple red cap with a black tassel, such as is worn by the Arabs with the emblem of the order and the name of the temple embroidered on the front. The dazzling color scheme and rainbow hues of the various patrols seemed out of keeping with the simple fez. Temples began to change the color of both fez and tassel to blend with the particular ideas of uniforms. As was natural, patrolmen of the Imperial Council meeting wore their fezes on the street, even when not in uniform. The resultant medley of fezes confused the organization and the public as to just what really constituted the official fez of the Shrine.

This was particularly unfortunate, as many other fraternal organizations had adopted the fez as headdress. As no "particular style" of fez was characteristic of the Shrine, all men who wore fezes were supposed to be "Shriners!"

At the time this article was written, the below laws on the subject were outlined in the by-laws of the Imperial Council, as follows. These continue to be relevant today and should be observed.

- Fez. The exclusive head covering of the order shall be the red Moroccan Fez with Black Tassel.
- Jewel and Name of Temple. The name of the temple of which the Noble is an active member, together with a facsimile of a scimitar and that portion of the jewel of the order consisting of the crescent, sphinx head and star, may be embroidered on the fez with gold or silver bullion or silk.
- Titles. The Imperial Chaplain, Potentates, Past Potentates, Records and Divan members may have their titles embroidered in small letters in gold or silver bullion or silk beneath the emblem on the fez. Active members of official uniformed units of a temple may likewise have the names of their units beneath the emblem on the fez.
- Imperial Officers. The Imperial Potentate shall have a row of 5 gold stars beneath the emblem of his fez. Each Past Imperial Potentate shall have a row of 5 stars, the 2 outermost of silver and the other 3 of gold. Each of the other Imperial officers, past or current, shall have a row of 3 gold stars beneath the emblem on his fez.
- Adornment. The embroidery on the fez may be adorned with rhinestone jewels of a size no larger than those officially recognized by the Imperial Council as number 12. One pin may be used to hold the tassel in place.
- Fez how and When Worn. The fez shall be worn in its proper shape without crushing, creasing or alteration; and no device, ornament, title, wording, or adornment other than that permitted by this section may be used on the fez. The fez may be worn only at meetings and gatherings of Nobles held under the authority of some legal body of the order. It may not be worn when or where prohibited by the Imperial Potentate.

If you have Tangier Shrine, Unit or Club specific clothing or other items that are no longer being used, please consider bringing them back to the shrine. As we know, only a Mason or Shriner can wear/display our iconography and we would like to ensure items remain with their owner or within masonic families, rather than in the public's hands. We will ensure that the items are handled appropriately. Likewise, if you have "Tangier" branded or "Past Potentate" branded items you would like to donate back to the shrine, we will ensure the items are preserved in our archive. You may leave the items at the office directed to me.

Thank you for reading. Please look forward to future entries as we navigate the history that is Tangier.
