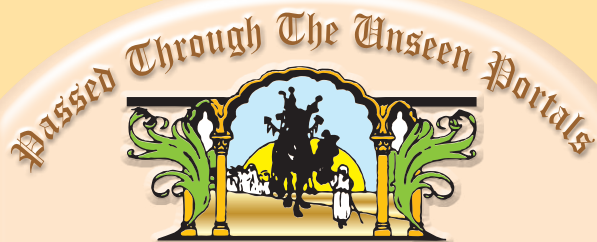

Put onions in bottom of 12" x 17" Pyrex dish. Add Ritz crackers, then sausage meat. Add a layer of onions, cream of mushroom soup, salt and seasoning salt. Sprinkle layer of cheese and pimento. Bake in preheated oven at 400 degrees for 1 hour.

Tangier Tales

History that is Tangier



Charles Tracy 1861-1913 Potentate: 1909



This month's article is presented from the perspective of our 16th Tangier Potentate, Charles Tracy. The "Shot Heard 'Round the World," or the "Battles of Lexington and Concord," as they are more commonly known, were fought on April 19, 1775. Much had taken place on both sides of the Atlantic, making armed conflict inevitable.

My great great grandfather, Perez Tracy, like many other men of the time, enlisted at once. He and his fellow soldiers had but one goal, expel British Forces from American shores. The war was lengthy, but the Americans would prevail and begin the journey toward a new, self-governed, nation. Perez couldn't have known it at the time, but 86 years later I would be born, and that new nation would find itself embroiled in another conflict, this time within its own borders.

I was born in Bloomington Illinois on October 2, 1861, during the early months of the Civil War. I was the second of five sons born to Timothy and Margaret (Davidson) Tracy. The first born, my brother William, died in 1860 at 11 months of age. Sadly, this was all too common at this time in America. I was joined by brothers Edward in 1863, Arthur in 1865 and Thomas in 1872.

In 1860, father had a farm in Dry Grove, Illinois with a personal real estate value of \$800.00. By 1870 we had moved to Santa Anna, Illinois to a new farm with a real estate value of \$5,000.00. Though operating the farm brought many challenges, my parents, brothers, and I were enjoying a good life together.

In 1874, just before my thirteenth birthday, my father passed away at age 40. Two months later, my maternal grandmother, Mary Davidson, passed away. These losses had a profound effect on our family, particularly my mother. Now a widow, her grief added to the challenge of providing for her boys. For a time, we went to live with my maternal grandfather on his farm near the town of Dry Grove, in McLean County Illinois.

By 1880 my brother Ed and I had struck out on our own, leaving our mother and two brothers, Arthur and Thomas, with our grandfather. I had moved to Minneapolis in 1879 when I was 18. I took a position as travelling salesman for a tobacco house with responsibility over the northwest territory. I travelled by train, streetcar, or any means available, to make new contacts. Success would come but was hard gained.

Though I travelled extensively, I kept contact with a wonderful girl named Sadie Myer. She and I were married in Saybrook Illinois on March 24, 1886. We set up housekeeping in Minneapolis, Minnesota and began our life together. Our first daughter, Alice, was born in 1888. Sadly, we said goodbye to her on February 26, 1888. Our second daughter was born on May 1, 1889, but did not survive the day. Both of our daughters are buried in Lakewood Cemetery in Minneapolis. Our first few years of marriage were marked by sadness, but we would find the strength to go on.

My travels took me to larger cities, as well as many small towns, but one was different. I came to Omaha on a business trip in 1891. Omaha was not yet forty years old. It was growing and I enjoyed my visit, so much so, I endeavored to stay. I collected my wife in Minneapolis and moved us to Omaha. In 1892, availing myself of the knowledge gained as a tobacco salesman, I established a retail cigar store at Sixteenth and Douglas streets. On October 14 of that year, my son, Donald Tracy, was born. We felt our family was now complete. The business was going well, we had many new friends and found great joy in our son. Our happiness was short lived, however. In early 1894, my beloved Sadie became ill. On February 28, 1894, aged 31, she passed away and we buried her in Forest Lawn Cemetery. My grief was tempered only by the need to provide for my young son and a focus upon the needs of my business. Though I couldn't imagine it at the time, my business and personal life would take a turn for the better.

Elizabeth Youle, whom I had known from my time in Illinois, became my wife on October 7, 1896. She was a wonderful wife and mother to my young son, Donald.

In the coming years, my brothers would join the company; Thomas as Vice President and Treasurer and Edward as Secretary. We incorporated the Tracy Brothers Company in 1902 and operated retail and wholesale locations at 1416 and 1523 Douglas Streets.

Since arriving in Omaha, my wife and I involved ourselves in our community and I became keenly interested in local politics. I became a Mason and was Master of St. John's Lodge in 1905. I purchased a farm two miles west of Benson in 1902 and set about improving and stocking the acreage. Benson was a small community but growing. I was the cashier and Director of the Bank of Benson and ran for several offices, serving two terms as the Mayor of Benson in 1909 and 1910.

In early March of 1913 Charles was exiting a streetcar and slipped, scraping his leg as he stumbled. Though there was an abrasion on his leg, he thought nothing more about it. After a few weeks, he sought treatment for his leg and was admitted to the Wise Memorial Hospital. He passed away on April 1, 1913, at age 51, due blood poisoning. St. John's Lodge conducted the service with Past Masters of St. John's Lodge serving as pallbearers and Past Potentates of Tangier Shrine serving as honorary pallbearers. His second wife Elizabeth would outlive him by twenty-eight years. She passed away in 1941 at the Fontenelle Boulevard Home where she had resided since 1932. She had previously been a twenty-year board member of the home.
