
Famous Pony Rider, Humanitarian, Was member of Tangier Temple

Nobles of Tangier Temple might be interested to know that a famous pony express rider, humanitarian and famous Nebraskan was a Noble...and a member of Tangier Temple.

William F. "Buffalo Bill" Cody became a member of Tangier on March 25, 1892. Serving as potentate at that time was Henry C. Akin.

The petition shows that Cody, born in Scott County, Iowa, was living in North Platte at the time his petition was presented to Tangier. The initiation fee was \$30. Signers on the petition were George R. Hammond and C.F. Iddings. Cody listed his occupation as stock raiser.

"Buffalo Bill's" Tangier Fez is among his personal effects at his grave site at Look Out Mountain, west of Denver.



The famous pony express rider, Indian fighter, scout, plainsman, humanitarian, and showman was born in 1846 and died January 10th, 1917. He was buried with full Masonic honors.

He was raised in Platte Valley Lodge No. 32, North Platte in 1871 and was a member of Euphrates Chapter No. 15, North Platte and Palestine Commandery No. 14 K.H. North Platte.



Cody was a government scout and guide for the 7th Kansas Cavalry and later was both a scout and guide operating against the Sioux and Cheyenne. He hunted buffalo for Kansas Pacific Railroad to feed the road construction laborers. In 18 months, it is reported, he killed 4,280 buffalo. He served as a general in the Nebraska National Guard during the Sioux outbreak in 1890-91 and was in the battle of Wounded Knee. In 1872 he served in the Nebraska Legislature.

"Buffalo Bill" was also a great showman and headed the

famous "Wild West Show," touring America and Europe.

There are numerous books written about Cody extolling his many virtues, humanitarian, and heroic deeds during his years of roaming the prairies of the Midwest. We are proud to claim him in Tangier.

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

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
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
