History that is Tangier



John B. Rahm (1853-1935) Potentate 1900

Fort Sumpter was fired upon at 4:30 a.m. on the early morning of April 12, 1861. Though many events had taken place which set the country upon the path toward war, the firing on Fort Sumpter in South Carolina's Charleston Harbor is considered, by most, to mark the beginning of the Civil War.

John Butler Rahm, also called J.B., was the seventh of 8 children born to Philip and Martha (Walden) Rahm. He was a lad of seven or eight years, and living in Richmond Virginia, when the war between the states began. Given his age, he could not have understood the ramifications this action would have for the country or, more particularly, for his family.

J.B.'s father, Philip Rahm, was a blacksmith born in Germany and he and Martha were married in Richmond Virginia on July 15, 1841. By all accounts, Philip was an industrious man. He established the "Eagle Machine Works," sometimes called the "Eagle Foundry," in Richmond.

The firm focused upon the manufacture of Stationary and Portable Steam Engines for use in farming or industrial applications. Mr. Rahm's engines were different than most. He configured his heating tubes in a circle and his spark arrester and the arrangement of heating the water before it was poured into the boiler was well adapted to prevent explosion or fire. His engines were compact and simple to operate and were sold to all southern states and Brazil. At the Royal Agriculture Show at Windsor Virginia, in 1851, Mr. Rahm and his engines received the Gold Medal, 1st prize, from the New York State Agricultural Society.

During the years 1861-1865, J.B.'s father's company, Eagle Machine Works, was heavily engaged in the manufacture of ordinance and ammunition for the Confederate government, although they continued to produce farm machinery, as well.

One day, while helping his workers with a boiler, Philip injured his finger. He began to experience inflammation and symptoms of lockjaw. A physician removed the injured finger, but nothing more could be done. Philip died on January 10, 1862, aged 42 years. Martha, his first wife, had died of consumption January 1, 1860, at age 38.

After the death of Philip, his eldest son, Adolphus James Rahm, was released from his confederate detachment to take over the operation of Eagle Machine Works and its munition production. A second son, Frank Henry Rahm, remained in the confederate army, serving with the Richmond Howitzers and Mosby's Rangers. During the burning of Richmond in April 1865, the Eagle Machine Works was destroyed. Adolphus Rahm would rebuild the business after the war and would continue in that line of work until 1876.

By age 12, in 1865, J.B. Rahm had experienced several life changing events. He buried his mother in 1860 and his younger brother, Peter, passed away in 1861. The Civil War began in 1861 and he watched his two older brothers, Adolphus and Frank, join the fighting. His father remarried in 1861 and a stepmother, Annie Foster, joined the family. He buried his father in 1862 and the family business was destroyed when Richmond burned in 1865.

It is unclear when J.B. left Richmond Virginia, but he and wife Virginia (Grant) Rahm can be found in Kansas City, in about 1880. Their first child, Lester, was born in Kansas City in 1882 and a daughter, Helen, would follow in 1888. By 1896 the couple were living in Omaha, where their fourth child, Florence, was born. Sadly, their third child, an infant, would not survive.

The 1900 Census finds the family living in Omaha Nebraska at 1106 S. 31st. Street. J.B. was 47 years of age and Manager of U.S. Supply Company. John's son, Lester Rahm, would follow in this father's footsteps and join the U.S. Supply Company as a salesman.

John was an avid golfer and widely known in the golf circles in Omaha. He belonged to the Omaha Country Club and was possessed of such talent that he was selected a member of the American Golf Team competing in the 1904 Summer Olympics, held in St. Louis. He and his teammates would receive a Bronze Medal for the United States. Although he lost in the first round, John also competed in the match play portion of the 1902 U.S. Amateur.

In 1910, Lester Rahm succumbed to Typhoid fever in Oklahoma City, at the age of 28 years. He was employed as a traveling Salesman for U.S. Supply company. Lester and his wife, Lois (Brooks) Rahm, had been married in 1909. J.B. boarded a train to accompany his son's body back to Omaha, for burial, in Forest Lawn Cemetery.

J.B. was Tangier Shrine Potentate in 1900 and had been a member of most all appendant bodies of Masonry. He was active in the business and civic circles in Omaha. During his working life, J. B. served multiple terms as president of the Central Supply Association, consisting of dealers of plumbers' suppliers from the mid-west states.

J.B. retired from the U.S. Supply Company in 1929, as General Manager. He had contributed over 45 years of his working life to the success of the company.

On July 28, 1935, John Butler Rahm, laid down his working tools, leaving his widow Virginia and two daughters to mourn his passing. He and wife Virginia are buried in Forest Lawn Cemetery.

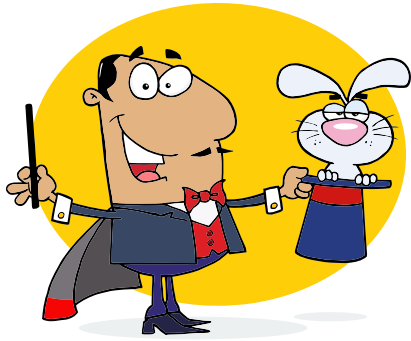

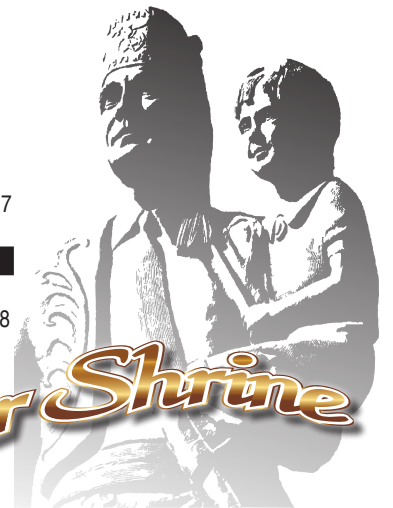
