Last month, the Chanters performed in their annual Christmas Tour (somewhat abbreviated due to Covid) for senior living centers, etc.

The Chanters are saddened to report the death of Chanter and 2021 Captain, Noble Kevin Throckmorton, who was born in Council Bluffs, Iowa, on December 14, 1951. He married and moved to O'Neill, Nebraska, where he was raised to a Master Mason in Garfield Lodge #95 on April 16, 1982. Kevin joined Scottish Rite and Tangier Shrine in 1988. After he moved to Omaha, Kevin became a dual member of Capitol #3 in October 2015, where he served as Worshipful Master in 2019 and 2020. He joined the Chanters as a bass several years ago. Please keep Kevin's wife Missy and his 8 children and 24 grandchildren in your thoughts and prayers.

Last October, the Chanters held elections, and Noble Hal Cottrell was elected Captain. Hal was born in West Virginia and grew up in a musical family. He says he began his music career at the age of 10. In 1984, Hal entered the US Air Force and retired from the USAF in 2009, returning to the Bellevue area. He became a Master Mason in 2008 and was the Master of Bellevue Lodge #325 in 2016 and 2017. Hal became a Shriner in 2010 and joined the Chanters in 2018. 

Update from the Clinic — Greetings & Happy Holidays!

Wow, what a year... Here we are already in December and as the Clinic Administrator I am just completing 5 months on the job. So much is happening as we prepare for 2022 and see even greater opportunity to transform how we care for all children regardless of means to pay with the best care anywhere. And while this is very exciting we all still have a lot of work to do.

As Shrine members you can help beyond the incredible assistance you all provide today with the volunteering, event support and incredible fund raising. One of our biggest challenges we face today is that of legacy. This incredible legacy Shriners has had for the past 100 years is outstanding, but it also challenges us for the future. Over these past three weeks I have heard we are closed, we only see "free" kids and we do not accept insurance. Sadly, this has mainly come from providers in our markets and individuals in the community. Even more challenging, are the many who do not know us at all or only recognize the Shriners as a group of men who wear a fez, are in parades and some recognize the Shriners as a circus. We have work to do...

The opportunity we all have is to help spread the word. Shriners Children's is a premier pediatric orthopedic healthcare organization who sees all patients with pediatric orthopedic needs, regardless of means to pay, providing the best care anywhere. What does that mean? As each of you promote or refer patients to the clinic what you need them to know is that as an organization we can help. We accept all insurances, we treat all pediatric orthopedic needs regardless if it is genetic condition or a traumatic event, and we have a network of clinics, hospitals and ambulatory surgery centers spread throughout the United States, Mexico and Canada.

Operationally we are enhancing a number of other opportunities. One of the biggest will be that of direct referrals for our ancillary support services. Initially this will be with Therapy but should soon include Imaging and Prosthetics and Orthotics (POPs). We are also improving our Outreach model of care to ensure we are optimizing our resources by sending the appropriate skill level and enhancing the use of technologies to better care for children remotely. Additionally, in 2022 we look at expand our network with additional partnerships in our markets. While many of these discussions are preliminary, these relationships and models of care is what will help ensure Shriners Children's establishes a foundation for the next 100 years.

- Cangier Cales History that is Tangier

Greetings,

I'm sure we would all agree that our Shriner's philanthropy is one of the best of its kind ever created. Though we would be a bit biased, I am sure we would also say that we are one of the best Shrine Center's ever to be created. It would certainly be true to say that we enjoy one of the most active memberships within the Shrine organization. Our Shrine Center welcomes Nobles and their families six day a week, with unlimited opportunities to become engaged and give back. Exactly how it should be.

No organization, however large or small, can operate on autopilot. The successful organization we enjoy today, is the direct result of the continued dedication and commitment of individuals. This was true in 1889 and continues to be true today. Our success is because of each of you.

I encourage each of you to get involved with a Unit and/or Club and to seek higher elected office when you feel the time is right. Further, I encourage each Unit and Club to document their history or revise and update your existing history. Our history provides continuity and direction and binds our Masonic and Shrine families together.

Peeking at the Past

The Tangier Temple Band, pictured here in Washington D.C. in 1923, was established in 1919 and has been an organized group for over 100 years. Those first eight members became the second oldest organized unit within Tangier Shrine and were under the direction of Frank Elias. From 1921-1930 the group was known as the Tangier Patrol Band. After a reorganization in 1930, the band became known as the Tangier Temple Band. Frank Elias would continue his tenure as



Director from 1919-1930; though he was assisted, from time to time, by Fred Phelps and Oscar Lieben.

One of the original eight band members was Fred Elias, Frank's brother. Frank and Fred could not have known it then, but they had begun a legacy not only for the Tangier Temple Band, but for their family. Fred Elias was our very own Past Potentate, Frank Kroupa's, grandfather. Frank and Fred Kroupa, along with their families, continue the legacy passed to them and Tangier is the better for it.

Once organized, the band wasted no time sharing their talents and promoting Tangier Shrine. Their first journey, a trip of 150 miles, found them performing in Grand Island, Nebraska. Throughout the 1920's the group continued to be on the move, they could be found in places like Portland, Oregon and Miami, Florida and many points in between.

The band is administratively overseen by a Captain and led by a Director. In many cases, over the years, this person has been one and the same. Other times, there has been a Captain and Director. One of the early Captains was Dr. Harvey McNichols, who reigned from 1928-1931. He was a member of the John Phillip Sousa Concert Band and would go on to have a son, Larry, who was a member of the Press Club Ball Orchestra. Another distinguished alumnus was Keith Latey. He was composer of 25 marches for brass bands. He was so well thought of and respected for his contributions; Council Bluffs honored him with "Keith Latey Day" on September 6, 1981. Nobel Latey passed on August 13, 1987, at the age of 91.

In 1932, Dr. Floyd Williams, a Chiropractor and clarinetist, took the helm as Director. Doc Williams had joined the band in 1923 and would hold the position of Director until 1965, a total of 33 years. Doc continued to participate in the band until 1980, bringing his overall years of service to 57. A shining example of being Connected, Committed and Engaged. Doc Williams answered his final call in 1985 at the age of 92.

Ted Sheil, a percussionist, would hold the baton for the next two years. The family's talent was not reserved for Ted, he had a daughter Martha that became an accomplished and well-known opera singer. Next, Mal Dunn would take on Directing duties from 1967-1975. Mall was a local orchestra leader and was nationally known for his directing and compositions. He wrote the Tangier Temple Song, performed by our Shrine Chanters and also wrote arrangements for the Lawrence Welk Orchestra.

Over the ensuing decades; the Tangier Temple Band could be found performing at CSSA, local parades, as well as Masonic and Shrine events, at home, and around the country. While their numbers may not be what they once were, the Tangier Temple Band has remained committed to Tangier Shrine.

We have many talented members of Tangier Shrine who I am sure would be welcomed by this group. Let's "Strike Up the Band" and help them continue the legacy handed them by Frank Elias and so many other distinguished Nobles. (source: Tangier Shrine Band History by Wayne D. Hansen December 28, 1998. Tangier Shrine History 1889-1989)

The Shrine Bowl Unit was established in 1979. At that time, eighteen eager Nobles joined, then Commander, Bruce Williams. The unit quickly became identified by their familiar parade equipment; a king-sized fiberglass football and shoe and motorized football helmet, built around a VW bug. Later, the unit would introduce Indy cars as parade vehicles. Today, the unit maintains a parade bus and float with inflatable football.







Once formed, the Shrine Bowl Unit's primary focus was to assist the Potentate and his Divan better manage Tangier Shrine Center's involvement with the promotion of the Nebraska North South Shrine Bowl Football Game, played each year by high school seniors from across the state of Nebraska. Their first task was to become responsible for the steak fry held each year to honor the north coaches, football players and their parents. This remains one of the highlights for the unit each year and is a great opportunity to showcase the Shriner's mission. As our Master of Ceremony for some many years, Illustrious Sir PP Jim Parks, always reminds the players, "the score doesn't matter." The winners are our kids. That's who this game is played for." He is absolutely right!

In addition to the support of Shrine Bowl Inc. of Nebraska, the Shrine Bowl Unit organizes many activities and participates in various spectacles

In addition to the support of Shrine Bowl Inc. of Nebraska, the Shrine Bowl Unit organizes many activities and participates in various spectacles throughout the year. These activities have included Golf Outings, Nebraska Football Spring Game excursions, Fish Fry's, parading, as well as the very popular "Big Red Dinners." Five times each year during the football and recruiting seasons; the unit brings in a coach, member of the media, former player, etc. to celebrate Nebraska Football. This is a very well attended and a looked forward to fundraiser each year and offers visibility into our Shrine philanthropy.

The Shrine Bowl Unit now enjoys a membership greater than 70 members. If you are looking to join a fun, highly visible and active group, the Shrine Bowl Unit would love to have you. No scholarship needed, simply "Walk On!" (source: SBU archives. Tim Bernet SBU historian)




