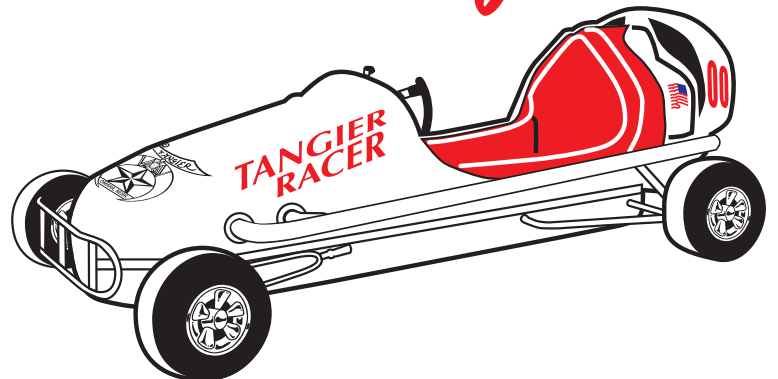

Tangier Tales

History that is Tangier



What's all the Horsin' Around?

He wore a white beaver 10-gallon hat, a suit the color of sandstone, pointed toed leather boots and a large coat with a brown fur collar. Who was this man sporting a nine-carat diamond ring on his left hand and wearing a belt buckle with the message "America's Champion Cowboy" adorned with a ten-carat diamond? Those boys and girls, and parent's too, visiting Union Station in Omaha Nebraska, knew very well who this dashing man was. Why it was Tom Mix, of course. But why was he visiting the gateway city?

Thomas Hezekiah Mix was born on January 6, 1880, in Mix Run, Pennsylvania to Edwin and Elizabeth (Heistand) Mix. The city of Mix Run was named after Tom's great great grandfather who was one of the first lumbermen in that part of Pennsylvania. Tom's father was Stable Master for a man who attained his wealth in the lumber industry. It was here Tom learned to ride and developed his life-long love of horses.

1898 saw the outbreak of the Spanish American War. Tom was 18 and looking for adventure. He enlisted in the Army, but his unit was never sent to the fight. He was given an extended furlough so that he could get married to his first wife, Grace I. Allin. He "forgot" to return to the Army but was never court-martialed.

By 1909 Mix had married his third wife, there would be two more, and was found working for the Miller Brothers 101 Ranch in Oklahoma. They were one of the largest ranching outfits in the United States, spread over 101,000 acres. The brothers had their own touring Wild West show. Tom's skill at horsemanship and shooting made him a standout and he won many riding and roping contests in the west.

Tom began making western films in supporting roles with the Selig Polyscope Company in 1909. His star began to rise in 1910 when he starred in the film "Ranch Life in the Great Southwest." He starred as himself, showcasing his skills as a cattle wrangler. Mix would appear in 291 movies between 1909 and 1935, some accounts credit him with as many as 336 feature films. Whichever may be correct, all but nine of his films were silent pictures. He would also enjoy a successful radio series called the "Tom Mix Ralston Straight Shooters." Interestingly enough, he never appeared on the broadcasts. He once took a bullet through the throat as well as several broken noses which rendered his voice "not fit" for radio. Mix was played by many other actors throughout the radio shows 1930-1950's run.

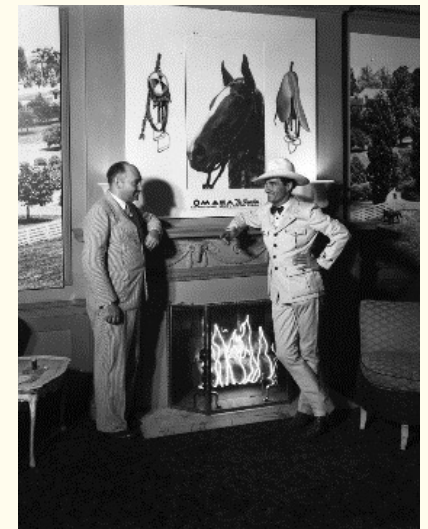
Mix and his career were "riding high" when on February 21, 1925, he was raised at Utopia Lodge No. 537 in Los Angeles California. He was also a member of Scottish Rite, Royal Arch and was a member of the 233 Club, a social club claiming over 1,700 Masons from the motion picture industry. Mix was also a proud Noble of Al Malaikah Shrine Temple in Los Angeles.

Union Station was awash with crowds and excitement on April 7, 1928, as Tom Mix and his famous horse "Tony" arrived in Omaha. "That's him!" "That's Tom!" the kids shouted. Though he was escorted by Omaha Police, bedecked in cowboy hats and bandanas, along with their uniforms, Mix shook hands with as many boys and girls as time allowed.

Mix was in town for a week's bill at the Orpheum Theatre and several events were held in his honor. Though many gala events were held, his favorite events involved the kids. He was one of the judges of the best dressed cowboy or cowgirl contest and the contest to see which boy or girl could wield the best lasso. He also met the boys at the Masonic Home and later was a guest at the Spring Ceremonial of Tangier Temple. On April 13, 1928, while in town, Mix was elected an Honorary Lifetime Noble of Tangier Temple.

On October 12, 1940, while traveling north to Phoenix on U.S. Highway 80, just south of Florence, Mix came upon construction barriers. A bridge had washed out during a flash flood. Mix was unable to stop in time and his vehicle overturned in a gully. He was 60 years old.

A memorial, erected at the site of the accident, reads, "In memory of Tom Mix, whose spirit left his body on this spot and whose characterization and portrayals in life served to better fix memories of the old West in the minds of living men."
