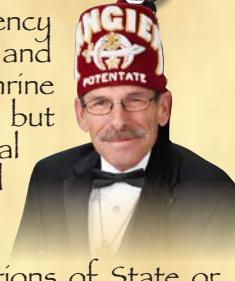

Potentate's Message

In keeping with the State of Emergency that has been declared both federally and in the State of Nebraska, Tangier Shrine Center and all activities, including but not limited to all Regular and Special Communications, fund raising, and social events are cancelled until at least May 1, 2020. If the state of emergency is lifted or recommendations of State or Federal change, the closing of Tangier will be revisited and updated as required.



In times of uncertainty, our strong fraternal bonds lift and support us in ways we could not have imagined. During this unprecedented worldwide health crisis, we are concerned about the health of our families, our fraternal family, our communities, our Shriners Hospitals' patients, families, and of course, ourselves. Your leaders of Tangier Shrine are deeply concerned about each of you as well.

We are aware of the many sacrifices and changes you have made to safeguard our fraternity members, families, and your communities by canceling meetings, events and fundraisers. I know that many of you have been forced to discontinue your valuable volunteer work providing patient transportation and other services at our hospitals. In our recent history, this seems unheard of, but we share the legacy of our founders in responding to the needs of our communities, especially those needs of the children of our countries

As concerns about COVID-19 continue to rise, many are left wondering what can be done. Although the ongoing outbreak likely resulted from people who were exposed to infected animals, COVID-19 can spread between people through their respiratory secretions, especially when they cough or sneeze.

According to the Centers for Disease and Control and Prevention (CDC), the spread of COVID-19 from person-to-person most likely occurs among close contacts who are within 6 feet of each other. It's unclear at this time if a person can get COVID-19 by touching a surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching their own mouth, nose or eyes.

Be safe, take care of your health, our families, our fraternal family, our communities and follow the advice of our Federal and State authorities during these difficult times. Hopefully we will get through this soon and life as we knew it can get back to normal.

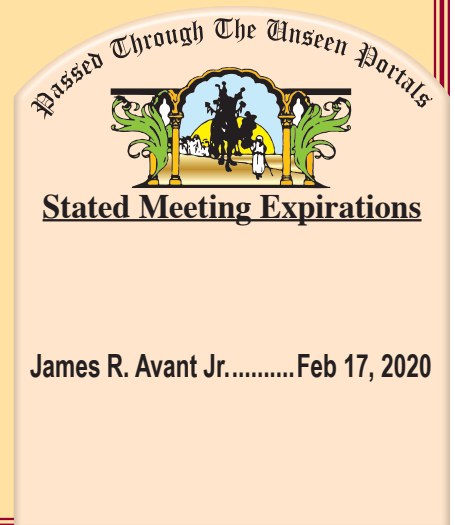

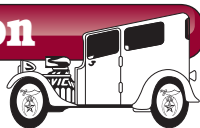

Corvette Club

I have already seen Corvettes out of hibernation and out and about. I hope you all have been out enjoying yours. Unless you are going on the Potentates trip, there doesn't look like there are a lot of big events this month. That doesn't mean there aren't plenty of things to do in preparation for upcoming TSCC events. We have a busy parade schedule starting soon and we definitely want as many Corvettes as we can get at each one. There's no denying we have a commanding presence among the clubs of Tangier Shrine because of the efforts of each of us. That is something to be proud of. If any members need some help getting their car ready for the parades or especially for Central States, may it be some detailing or an oil change or the like, don't hesitate to ask. Those tasks aren't work, they are a labor of love and we'll get it done.

Corvette College: This month as dealerships and consumers are taking delivery of the first production mid engine Corvette, it is pertinent to mention some history of the rear engine Corvette. In 1964 engineers at Chevrolet wanted to see if a Corvette with the center of gravity just in front of the rear

wheels, due to the weight of the engine placed behind them, could drive and handle safely. The prototype was dubbed XP-819. The chassis used an aluminum, reverse rotation, marine V8 and two speed transmission. When it was complete the body was designed and the car was ready for testing. With the use of larger rear tires, the car preformed, but not very well. During one test the car was fitted with stock Corvette wheels and tires. With the rear bias weight distribution and lack of grip from the smaller tires the XP-819 crashed and the program was scrapped. The body design of the XP-819 heavily influenced the new design of the C3 1968 Corvette. There were seven mid-engine Corvette prototypes between 1964 and 2020.

Influencing Treatment and Improving Lives through Research

Conducting contemporary, meticulous and innovative research to improve patient care and enhance medical knowledge of injury and disease is one of the three parts of the overall mission of Shriners Hospitals for Children®.

What began as a small research effort with a budget of \$12,000 is now a multimillion-dollar sophisticated program that involves peer review of grant applications and is recognized around the world. Over the years, our researchers have made significant breakthroughs in all four of our service lines – orthopaedics, burns, spinal cord injury, and cleft lip and palate – improving the care and quality of life for countless children worldwide.

Shriners Hospitals for Children funds innovative research projects, special shared facilities, and training fellowships. The 2018 research budget is supporting a total of 148 grants (new, renewal, revision and continuation): 21 developmental research projects, 57 bench science projects, 24 clinical research projects, 24 Special Shared Facilities and 20 fellowships.

In addition to research grants, support is also provided for fellowships as a component of the organization's educational mission of training new researchers.

Research Emphasis and Direction

Today, our research efforts are focused on translational research, i.e. bench-to-bedside and bedside-to-bench research, and regenerative medicine. Although regenerative medicine is in its early stages, it has the potential to treat, reduce or eliminate the long-term causes of many of the conditions that affect our patients, including burns and other skin injuries, as well as orthopaedic and neuromuscular injury and disease. The field of regenerative medicine offers a unique chance for translational research, and a significant opportunity for personalized medicine for our patients.

We also continue to promote clinical research. We examine new treatment modalities, as well as outcomes associated with care, in order to continuously improve the clinical attention we give to our patients.

Partnerships Promote Our Goals

Our close affiliations with colleges and universities across the country allow us to enhance the quality and scope of our research. Relationships like those



with Massachusetts General Hospital, Harvard Medical School, Oregon Health Sciences University, Washington University-St. Louis, Temple University, the University of California-Davis, University of Cincinnati, University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston, and many others help us meet our goals of improving clinical practice and pursuing fundamental scientific theories.

Research Projects

Examples of research underway throughout our health care system include projects in these areas:

- The genetics of metabolic bone disease
- The relationship between the ability to fight disease and genetic makeup
- The link between folate and spina bifida
- Effective strategies for repairing spinal cord injury
- The causes of cerebral palsy and effective therapies for its prevention and treatment
- Ways to grow new bone and cartilage using technology and therapies

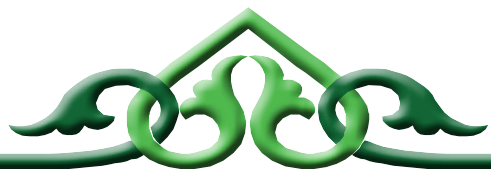

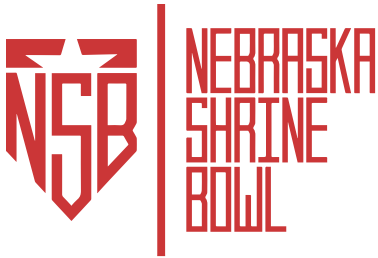

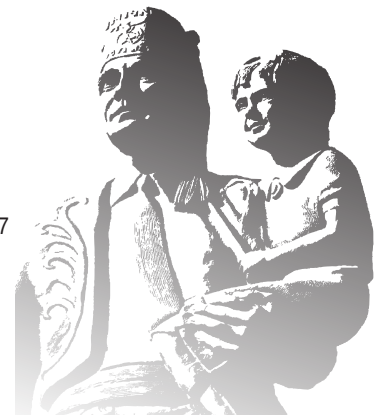
