EOS is a 2D/3D muscle skeletal diagnostic imaging system. The device has been developed to produce a high quality 2D, full body radiographs in standing, sitting and squatting positions. Three dimensional images can be reconstructed via sterEOS software.

You might ask of what benefit this new technology is to our pediatric patients? The basic fact is that it is both faster and safer. In a matter of six seconds it can create images of the front and side view of a child's body with a markedly reduced dose of radiation. The radiation dose is reduced by 50-85% when compared with the standard X-ray, and the image is of a high quality. With the 2D/3D images and more accurate measurements, the physicians can construct a more personalized treatment and pre-operative plan for each patient.

Of optimum importance is the reduction of radiation dosage for the pediatric patients who require multiple X-rays to follow their scoliosis, limb deficiencies, cerebral palsy, and hemiplegia (paralysis of one side of the body). The patients with scoliosis may require up to four radiation exposures per year and the cumulative reduction of their exposure is of great importance.

In the Shrine publication entitled "Ahead of the Curve" it is quoted that "Shriners Hospitals for Children has the largest number of EOS imaging systems of any health care organization." Your financial support for this type of equipment is greatly appreciated and has helped to keep these hospitals on the cutting edge of technology.

Shriners Hospital Experience Inspires Her to Help Young Girls



Courtney Paige Nelson dreamed of becoming a model when she was a girl. At the age of 10, she developed scoliosis. Her doctor said to wait and watch.

Around the age of 13, Courtney grew 6 1/2 inches in one year. The rapid growth spurt progressed her disease so severely, it gave her a pronounced hump, a swayback and a spine that was so twisted it pushed out her ribs and pressed on her lungs. Courtney, who attended Aragon High School in San Mateo, also suffered at school. Selfconscious about her appearance, she started wearing baggy sweatshirts three sizes too big to hide her

kyphotic hump, but classmates still ridiculed her.

The severity of her illness now necessitated surgery. A Shriner connected the family with Shriners Hospitals for Children, and Courtney came to Sacramento for treatment. "It didn't feel like a hospital when I walked in there," Courtney says. "It was comforting."

At 15, Courtney had the vertebrae in her spine fused in about a dozen places. The surgeons removed bone from her right hip and fashioned it into one solid backbone. She contracted pneumonia during her month-long stay. It was a difficult time but she attributes her recovery in part to the nurses who cared for her.

"The hospital makes sure that every kid there is as comfortable and happy as possible," she says.

With a scar running down her spine and a keloid on her hip, Courtney gave up her modeling dreams. But at the age of 21, she was discovered in San Francisco. For four years, she struggled against the perception that being beautiful means looking flawless; her scars lost her jobs. That began changing when a casting agent for America's Next Top Model found her on Instagram.

Last year Courtney filmed cycle 23 of the reality TV show in New York City and made it to the final four. She decided to use her celebrity to help change industry attitudes and raise awareness about the severity of scoliosis, especially in girls. She wanted to be the first model on the show with scoliosis, and to talk openly about it. Girls suffering from the disease inundated her with positive feedback. "I didn't realize it was going to have that big of an effect on people," she says.

Having scoliosis changed her, deepening her compassion for people who are sick. "I think being a patient at Shriners helped me understand that I want to give back more to people and I want to be an inspiration to younger girls," she says. "Whatever I do, I want to be able to help young girls who have scoliosis."

Meet Alec, Shriners Hospitals for Children Superstar

You may recognize 15-year-old Alec from the various commercials for Shriners Hospitals for Children[®] that have aired nationally. Alec, a patient of Shriners Hospitals for Children — Chicago, has become a popular television star, been interviewed on numerous national news and talk shows, and has captured the hearts of many with his adorable smile and charming personality.

The Story Behind the Star

Alec lives in the suburbs of Chicago, and is quite the active teenager. From playing wheelchair softball and basketball, to assistant coaching tee-ball, he loves just about any sport. However, because he has Osteogenesis Imperfecta (OI), also known as brittle bone disease, Alec's approach to his favorite activities is a little different.

Ol is a genetic bone disorder characterized by fragile bones that can frequently and easily break, which can make it hard for Alec to participate in sports. The underlying cause of Ol is a lack of collagen – or abnormal collagen – in the bones that prevents them from absorbing appropriate minerals and developing correctly. As a patient of the Chicago Shriners Hospital, Alec receives intravenous (IV) infusions of pamidronate, a medication that slows down the process of bone resorption and improves bone mass. He also routinely visits the hospital for physical therapy.

Thanks to the outstanding care and innovative treatment Alec receives at the Chicago Shriners Hospital, his muscles are strengthening and his bones are breaking less often. This provides Alec with more opportunities to indulge in his passion for sports. Alec often participates in up to four hours of sports a day; his mother, Alma, works hard to ensure his homework and physical therapy are done, as well.

They manage to fit it all in. Alec has been coming to the Chicago Shriners Hospital for treatment since 2002. Since then, he has made great progress thanks to his customized treatment with our rehabilitation specialists.

Alec's mom is grateful for the excellent care her son has received. "If there is a number system to rate the hospital from one to 10, I'd give it a 16," she said. "They are always working with him and pushing him to work hard."

Currently, Alec is building more strength and increasing muscle development through aquatic therapy. The hospital's therapists work with Alec in a temperaturecontrolled hydrotherapy pool using aquatic treadmills and other equipment. Tapping into Alec's love for sports, his therapist has even incorporated water basketball into rehabilitation sessions.


