

The Onion recipe for this month is Stuffed Vidalia Onions. Ingredients: 6 large Vidalia onions, 1 1/2 cups crumbled cornbread, 1/2 cup diced cooked potatoes, 1 cup broth or water, 1 hard boiled egg, 1 envelope instant cream of chicken soup mix, salt and pepper to taste. Peel and wash onions. Simmer in enough water to cover onions about 10 minutes or until almost tender. Remove pulp from onions, leaving only the two outside layers of onion. Add onion pulp to other ingredients. Place ingredients in blender and blend for a few seconds for a smooth stuffing. Place onion shells in lightly greased muffin tins or custard cups. Fill with stuffing and sprinkle with paprika. Bake in slow oven 325 degrees for about 30 minutes. To serve, place onions around meal.

March - those very cold, windy days of February are about to end. Spring arrives on the 20th.



Free Scoliosis SpineScreen App Developed by Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Scoliosis is an abnormal curvature of the spine that can limit movement and sometimes lead to other health problems. Usually it is diagnosed between the ages of 10 and 15 and is often found at 7th grade physicals. It's particularly visible during times of rapid growth spurts, and of course, the earlier it is detected and treated, the better the outcome of the treatment.

It affects anywhere from six to nine million people in the United States, and in 85% of affected people there is no known cause. However, it does seem to run in families and children in these families should be closely monitored. Some signs of scoliosis are: 1: Uneven shoulders and hips, noted when standing straight and tall without shoes on and with feet together. 2: Body or head leans to one side. 3: Ribs are asymmetric and stick up on one side.


Shriners Hospitals for Children has developed SpineScreen. This is a free app that allows parents to screen their children in the comfort of their own home. The app is educational as well as practical. It teaches the parent how to perform a scoliosis examination, how to schedule reminders to recheck the back, and learn the signs and symptoms of scoliosis. This app is only a screening tool and if there are questionable results, the child should always be followed up by a doctor's examination.

Tell your friends and family about this app and download it on your cell phone today to use as a screening tool on your children or grandchildren. Just type SpineScreen in the search window, download the app, and then just follow the directions.
