With the cooler weather moving in, a few Arbor Shrine members will be heading south until Spring and we will miss seeing them until warmer weather is here in Nebraska.

Here is another soup recipe for this month, French Onion Soup Au Gratin: 2 to 3 medium onions, sliced very thin; 4 tablespoons margarine or butter, melted; 4 cups beef broth or 2 cans beef consomme;

1/2 cup water; salt and pepper to taste; 1/2 cup Madeira wine (optional); Parmesan croutons;

1/2 cup shredded Swiss cheese. Cook onions in butter in a large skillet, covered, until onions are tender (about 5 minutes). Uncover skillet and continue cooking onions until well browned, stirring occasionally. Stir in broth & water, cover and simmer 30 minutes. Add salt and pepper, stir in wine if desired. Ladle soup into individual ovenproof dishes, place a Parmesan Crouton on each serving and sprinkle with Swiss cheese. Bake at 400 degrees for 15 minutes or until cheese is melted and golden brown. Enjoy.

We will always welcome new members. Any man with a joy for singing who is interested in joining us should contact any Chanter. That's my update for December. Merry Christmas and hear the angels sing!



The events keep on coming: newly elected officers for Arab Patrol; new slate of activities; planning for Circus (lets hope this 2018 season is great) and on and on.



Official Call for Elections Thursday, December 14, 2017 Tangier Shriners, Oasis of Omaha, Desert of Nebraska

The annual elections of Tangier Shriners will be held on Thursday, December 14, 2017 at 2823 S. 84th Street, Omaha Nebraska at 7:30 p.m. No later than 9:00 p.m. the annual election will start. Tangier Temple will elect seven Divan members, a Trustee for a four year term, Representatives to the Imperial

Council and Central States Shrine Association, and any openings which may occur in the interim.

Members must have their 2017 Dues Card for admission to this meeting

FROM IMPERIAL BY-LAWS (IOWA CORPORATION)

Article 25

- 325.4 When Elected. Each Temple must elect its Officers and Representatives at its annual meeting in January unless it's bylaws allow the election to occur at the temple's stated meeting in December.
- 325.5 Ballot. Election of officers shall be by separate written ballot and by a majority vote of those present and voting. A blanket ballot is prohibited.
- 325.6 Time of Election. Nominations must commence no later than 9:00 p.m. and when that hour arrives all other business must cease and none may be transacted until the election is concluded.
- 325.7 Other Officers. The Temple may elect such other officers as its Bylaws provide.
- 325.8 Nominations. Candidates for office and Representatives must be placed in nomination from the floor.
- 325.10 Representatives.
 - (a) Where a Temple elects more than one Representative, all candidates must be balloted for on one written ballot.
 - (b) Each member voting must vote only for the total number of Representatives to be elected, otherwise his ballot cannot be counted as a vote.
 - (c) A majority of those present and voting is necessary to elect each Representative.
 - (d) Only those candidates who receive a majority vote shall be declared elected.
 - (e) Successive written ballots must then be taken in the same manner on other candidates until all Representatives are elected.
 - (f) If more candidates receive a majority vote than the number of Representatives to be elected, then those receiving the greatest number of votes shall be declared elected.
 - (g) Blank ballots or ballots containing any markings other than the name of a candidate nominated from the floor are not votes and are not to be considered for any purpose.

325.11 Election Regulations.

- (a) A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.
- (b) The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.
- (c) For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.
- (d) At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.
