
The onion recipe for this month is, CREAMY SWEET ONIONS. 5 large white onions, thinly sliced, 2 1/4 cups sugar, 1 1/2 cups cider vinegar, 1 1/2 cups water, 4 teaspoons salt, 1 cup (8 ounces) sour cream, 3 tablespoons mayonnaise or salad dressing, 1/4 teaspoon celery seed, salt and pepper to taste. Place the onions in a large bowl. In a saucepan, combine the sugar, vinegar, water and salt. Bring to a boil; pour over onions. Cover and refrigerate overnight. Drain onions, discarding liquid. In a bowl, combine the sour cream, mayonnaise, celery seed, salt and pepper; mix well. Add onions and toss to coat. YIELD 4 cups

Official Call for Elections Thursday, December 12, 2019 Tangier Shriners, Oasis of Omaha, Desert of Nebraska

The annual elections of Tangier Shriners will be held on Thursday, December 12, 2019 at 2823 S. 84th Street, Omaha Nebraska at 7:30 p.m. No later than 9:00 p.m. the annual election will start. Tangier Temple will elect seven Divan members, a Trustee for a four year term, Representatives to the Imperial Council and Central States Shrine Association, and any openings which may occur in the interim.

Members must have their 2019 Dues Card for admission to this meeting

FROM IMPERIAL BY-LAWS (IOWA CORPORATION)

Article 25

- 325.4 When Elected. Each Temple must elect its Officers and Representatives at its annual meeting in January unless its bylaws allow the election to occur at the temple's stated meeting in December.
- 325.5 Ballot. Election of officers shall be by separate written ballot and by a majority vote of those present and voting. A blanket ballot is prohibited.
- 325.6 Time of Election. Nominations must commence no later than 9:00 p.m. and when that hour arrives all other business must cease and none may be transacted until the election is concluded.
- 325.7 Other Officers. The Temple may elect such other officers as its Bylaws provide.
- 325.8 Nominations. Candidates for office and Representatives must be placed in nomination from the floor.
- 325.10 Representatives.
 - (a) Where a Temple elects more than one Representative, all candidates must be balloted for on one written ballot.
 - (b) Each member voting must vote only for the total number of Representatives to be elected, otherwise his ballot cannot be counted as a vote.
 - (c) A majority of those present and voting is necessary to elect each Representative.
 - (d) Only those candidates who receive a majority vote shall be declared elected.
 - (e) Successive written ballots must then be taken in the same manner on other candidates until all Representatives are elected.

(f) If more candidates receive a majority vote than the number of Representatives to be elected, then those receiving the greatest number of votes shall be declared elected.

(g) Blank ballots or ballots containing any markings other than the name of a candidate nominated from the floor are not votes and are not to be considered for any purpose.

325.11 Election Regulations.

(a) A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.

(b) The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.

(c) For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.

(d) At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

Teamwork: Together Everyone Achieves More

Scott Kozin, M.D., chief of staff of Shriners Hospitals for Children® — Philadelphia, loves to tell the story of two, four, six, eight.

At 2 years old, Zion developed a serious infection that required his hands and feet to be amputated. At 4 years old, he received a kidney transplant; the donor was his mother, Pattie. Zion was taking antirejection drugs to keep his new kidney functioning. At age 6, Zion came to Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia for new prosthetic legs.

The evaluation of Zion's lower extremities prior to his receiving those first prosthetics from Shriners Hospitals was the impetus that led to his hand transplantation. The idea to give Zion hands was possible because he met the prerequisite of already being a transplant recipient and successfully taking immunosuppressant medications.

History-Making Surgery

At 8 years old, Zion received the first bilateral pediatric hand transplantation at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia along with help from Penn Medicine, Gift of Life and hand surgeons from our Philadelphia hospital, Dr. Kozin and Dan Zlotolow, M.D. During the 11-hour procedure, four teams of physicians worked to transplant the hands from the donor to Zion. The procedure required boney fixation, artery and venous anastomosis along with nerve and tendon reconstruction. The surgery was successful.

"The collaboration between these institutions was necessary to assemble the team and organize the players to orchestrate such a complex and demanding procedure that had never been performed on a child," said Dr. Kozin.

Becoming Independent

Zion is now three years post-hand transplant surgery.

Now 11 years old, he is a happy pre-teen and learning to be independent. He enjoys cooking and sports. "Zion is so comfortable living his normal life," said Pattie. "He enjoys playing laser tag with his friends, boxing, and is attending robotics camp this summer."

Zion continues to have occupational and physical therapy in his hometown. His mom couldn't be more happy with his progress. As Zion continues to grow and get taller, Pattie will bring him back to the Philadelphia Shriners Hospitals for Children



to be fitted for a new set of prosthetic legs. In the meantime, she is delighted that Zion is becoming more independent every day at home, at play, and at school.

More on our Physicians

Scott Kozin, M.D., is the chief of staff of Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia and is board certified by the American Board of Orthopaedic Surgery. He received an undergraduate degree in computer science from Duke University and earned a medical degree from Hahnemann University School of Medicine. Dr. Kozin completed his residencies in orthopaedic surgery at Albert Einstein Medical Center and Shriners Hospitals for Children - Philadelphia. He also completed a fellowship in hand and microvascular surgery at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota.

Dan A. Zlotolow, M.D., is a board certified orthopaedic hand surgeon for Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia. He received an undergraduate degree with honors in biology from Haverford College and earned a medical degree from the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine with early induction into the Alpha Omega Alpha Medical Honor Society. Dr. Zlotolow completed his residency in orthopaedics at the Montefiore Medical Center in New York and hand fellowship at the Roosevelt Hospital in New York and the Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for Children in Dallas.
